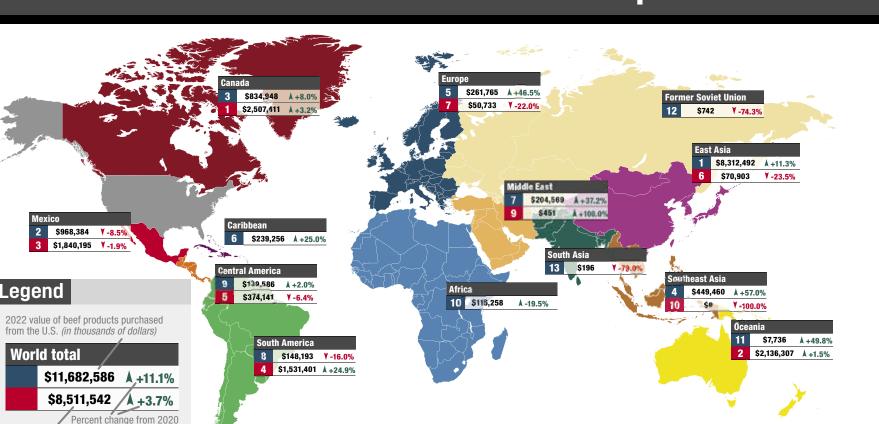

CATTLE 2023 beef statistics

Liquidation brings U.S. beef herd to lowest number in 60 years

a major cycle of liquidation in 2022, as drought, inflation, spiking interest rates, and labor issues all contributed to downsizing among cow-calf producers

The national beef cow herd decline 3.5% or a little over 1 million head, to 28.9 million cows, the lowest beef cow herd inventory since 1962. Overall cattle and calf inventory fell to its lowest level in seven years, to 89,274,100 head, a 3% drop from 2021

With a fourth year of La Nina weather across the West and southern Plains, a wide portion of cattle went to processing and created months of record slaughter figures. Total beef production hit another overall record mark of 28.93 billion pounds.

Most U.S. states saw heavy contraction in their cattle and beef cow herds because of the selloff. The southern Plains states were hit hardest Oklahoma declined some 140,000 head of beef cows, around 6.6% less, followed by Texas with a loss of 125,000 cows (down 2.8%), Kansas down 106,000 cows (down 7.5%), and Nebraska losing 99,000 head (5.5%

Trade sets new value records

Sales of U.S. beef across the world rose steadily to a global total value of \$11.7 billion, up 11% from the previous Korea (\$2.7 billion). Japan saw a decline of 4% in volume and 2^{-} % in value. year. Volume increased as well with 1,473,740 metric tons shipped to partners. Regions seeing major increases in sales included Canada, up 8%, as Canada saw a small increase in European Union, up 46% and East Asia, volume and value, but still not as high up 11.3% in export spending. exports in 2022.

Among global regions, imports to the U.S. were up 24.9% from South America, 3.2% from Canada, and 1.5% from Oceania. Total imports by the U.S. from global partners went up 3% in volume, and 4% in value.
