The U.S. beef industry had to take notice at another January report showing both total cattle inventory and the number of female beef cows making another significant decline. Total cattle and calves hit their lowest level since 1951 at 87,157,400 head. With the cow inventory and replacement heifer slaughter ongoing for twoplus years, the number of cows also slipped heavily, down 2.5% to 28.2 million head.

So it was no real surprise that the industry saw its first dip in beef production (down 4.6%), its first real drop in a decade. But with calf crop numbers being its lowest in a decade and the beef cows at a 62-year low, you have to ask vourself, where is this next wave of


2021-24 – Monthly cattle on feed, corn price and feeder calf prices


