

the 1990s, the number of people with a diagnosis of schizophrenia has increased in many countries (1).

There is a growing awareness of the need to improve the quality of life of people with schizophrenia. The World Health Organization (WHO) has developed a number of instruments to measure the quality of life of people with schizophrenia (2). The WHO Quality of Life Scale (WHOQOL) is one of the most widely used instruments (3).

The WHOQOL is a self-rated questionnaire that assesses the quality of life of people with schizophrenia. It consists of 263 items that are grouped into 26 domains. The domains are: physical health, psychological health, social relationships, and environment. The WHOQOL is a valid and reliable instrument for measuring the quality of life of people with schizophrenia (4).

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
